

Student Dress Code

The school board of the Bruneau-Grand View Joint School District No. 365 recognizes the individual right of students to choose their style of dress. Primary responsibility for appropriate dress and appearance rests with the student and his/her parent/guardian. Students shall not wear clothing which disrupts, or constitutes a health or safety hazard or that is destructive to school property or clothing that distracts from the educational process.

Inasmuch as it is the duty of the board to provide an educational atmosphere conducive to learning and to protect the health, safety, and morals of students, clothing or grooming habits that are disruptive of the educational process or that depict illegal or immoral acts is prohibited. Additionally, clothing which depicts by word or picture items or acts that are obscene, lewd, indecent or offensive are also prohibited, as is clothing with any depiction or words describing or advertising any alcohol, or tobacco product or any legal or illegal drug substance. Clothing and grooming habits must take into account the sensibilities of others.

The administration will develop guidelines and procedures to ensure uniform and consistent implementation of such policy on a building and district level, in the interest of maintaining a positive learning environment, giving consideration to regulations pertaining but not limited to:

- Hair
- Outerwear
- Clothing and/or attire
- Headwear
- Logos/tattoo
- Special activities
- Gang attire

Such administrative rules and regulations are to be available for school board review.

If the administration or his/her designee determines that a student's attire or grooming habit is disruptive of the educational atmosphere or is detrimental to the health or safety of the student or other students, that student will be required to remedy the situation or return to her/her home and change into suitable clothing before returning to school.
